
Caution Common Barriers:

Stop 1: **Teaming** ETA: 60 Min

- Meet with teacher
- Identify site support and stakeholders



Stop 2: **Goal Setting** ETA: 60 Min

- Select behaviors to decrease and increase
- Develop progress monitoring



Stop 3:

Functional Behavior Assessment ETA 60 Min **PTR Coach Observation**

- Interviews
- PTR FBA checklist
- Data review



Stop 4: **FBA Summary** ETA: 45 Min

- FBA summary
- Develop hypotheses
- Data review



Stop 5: **PTR Behavior** Intervention Plan

- ETA: 90 Min
- Select and prioritize intervention strategies
- Develop steps of plan



Stop 6: **Coaching** ETA: 30 Min

- Select preferred coaching method
- · Review and practice steps of plan
- Data review



Stop 7: Progress Monitoring ETA: 30 Min **PTR Coach** Observation

- Debrief and teacher reflection
- Determine if modifications to plan or additional coaching is needed
- Data review



Stop 8: Ensure Success ETA: 30 Min

 Ensure success of plan across people, routines and settings



Stop 9: Fade ICEI **Supports** ETA: 30 Min

 Promote sustainability with site support



Stop 10: Exit ICEI Supports ETA: 30 Min
